Why?

Because the fake sources were **specific**, while the official information was **vague or silent**.

## The uncomfortable truth

AI systems consistently prefer:

- **specific claims** over **cautious or non-committal statements**

For example:

*“We do not disclose employee counts.”*

*versus*

*“The company employs 9 people.”*

Even when the second statement is false, AI systems are more likely to repeat it.

This means:

- Silence is no longer neutral
- Generic language is no longer safe

- “We don’t comment” creates information gaps AI fills on its own
